

Lesson 10: The Feasts and Deuteronomy

Feasts:

Planting/Spring

1. Passover (14th day of the 1st month; lamb selected on 10th day)- 1 Cor 5:7
2. Unleavened Bread (15th day) (Bread without yeasts) – separation
3. First fruits (16th day) (1st Corinthians 15:23)
4. Weeks/Pentecost- (This festival commemorated the giving of the Law which took place 50 days after the Sabbath following the Passover.) In the New Testament this is when the Spirit came down.

Harvest

5. Trumpets (1st day of Tishri)- celebration with trumpet blast
6. Atonement (10th day)- Scapegoat
7. Tabernacles- (15th-22nd day)- This world isn't our home. God will tabernacle with us.

Treasures of Deuteronomy: (not exhaustive) (Jesus quoted this book three times to Satan in wilderness)

- The Greatest Commandment: Deuteronomy 6:4-7
- God's Discipline of His Children: Deuteronomy 8:1-6
- God wants your heart: Deuteronomy 10:12-22
- Sabbatical Year: Deuteronomy 15 (Year of Jubilee- 50th year) (Sabbath day)
- The Prophet: Deuteronomy 18:15-19; John 1:19-25
- Laws of Warfare: Deuteronomy 20
 - Priest blesses the people.
 - Some soldiers are permitted to leave.
 - Offer peace to those far away.
 - Completely destroy (close nations) so that you don't conform to their ways.
 - Don't damage the fruit bearing trees.
- Cross Dressing: Deuteronomy 22:5
- Blessings and Curses: Deuteronomy 28:1-19,44,58
- Life and Death: Deuteronomy 30:11-20
- Family Discipleship: 32:45-47
- Death of Moses: 34:10-12
